VOCATIONAL LEARNING PROGRAMMES

1. NATIONAL CERTIFICATE (VOCATIONAL) NQF LEVEL 2 - 4

NC(V) is a vocational programme at Level 2 - 4 of the National Qualifications Framework (NQF) and is offered by all public TVET Colleges countrywide. The qualification is intended to directly address the priority skills demand of the modern South African economy. The NC(V) qualification may be offered in a real workshop environment or in a simulated workplace environment.

Admission Requirements:

Students enrolling for NC(V) Engineering Programmes MUST take Mathematics, NOT Mathematical Literacy.

- A year-end school report for Grade 9, 10, or 11 report
- An NQF Level 1 qualification
- All entry level applicants must adhere to placement assessment criteria before admission

Umalusi recognises a credit transfer between the NSC and the NC(V) in the following subjetcs:

- English Home Language FAL (passed at 40% and above)
- Mathematics (passed at 30% and above)
- Mathematical Literacy (passed at 30% and above)

It is important to note that this concession applies only to the National Senior Certificate (NSC) and NOT to its predecessor, the Senior Certificate (SC).

Duration:

1 year per level (full time)

Programme Structure:

NC(V) consists of seven subjects of which the three fundamental subjects are compulsory):

- English 1st Additional Language
- Life Skills & Computer Literacy
- Mathematics or Mathematical Literacy

The four vocational subjects prepare learners for the world of work within the study field of their choice.

2. N4 - N6 REPORT 191 (NATED) PROGRAMMES / ALTERNATIVE POST MATRIC PROGRAMMES

Learners who have completed Grade 12 with admission to Higher Certificate or higher may consider studying further at a TVET College for a National N Diploma. The Report 191 (NATED) N4 - N6 programmes, also known as ALTERNATIVE POST SCHOOL PROGRAMMES, are offered in Engineering, Business and General Studies

Admission Requirements:

- Candidates must have Grade 12 (NSC)
- Enrolment in the N4 N6 Engineering programmes is subject to candidates having passed the relevant school subjects
- New students must enrol for all 4 subjects in the particular field
- The number of enrolments in these programmes is subject to the approved DHET prescripts and targets
- Students who enrol for N4 N6 programmes must comply with the required number of working hours in the relevant field of study before a National N Diploma will be issued

Trimester programmes

(1 trimester per level plus 24 months practical experience

in the relevant field

Semester programmes

(1 semester per level plus 18 months practical experience in the relevant field

ARTISAN DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

Due to a skills shortage in the engineering sector, the Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET) is looking to increase the number of students enrolled and trained in priority and critical skills areas. Artisans play a crucial role in the delivery of services especially in the engineering trades. South Africa needs to produce 30 000 artisans a year to help the economy grow.

What is an artisan?

An artisan is a skilled, well-trained and tested individual who is qualified in a specific trade e.g. Electrician, Bricklayer, Jeweller, etc.

Who should enrol?

- Out-of-school youth who want to specialise in one of these trades
- Individuals who already work in artisan trades
- Individuals who want to complete their trade test

Ways to become an ARTISAN:

 N2 Certificate with trade theory and 3 years' relevant work experience

- Technical trade theory quality-assured by a SETA and a minimum of 3 years relevant work experience NQF level 3 (RPL)
- Relevant National Certificate (Vocational) NQF level 4 engineering qualification and 18 months relevant work experience
- A 3-year apprenticeship programme through our Centre of Specialisation (CoS), culminating in the completion of a Trade Test
- Completion of a relevant Occupational Certificate in a chosen trade through a learnership, and its accompanying Trade Test
